KY TACF New American Chestnut Found

The American Chestnut Foundation identified the largest living American Chestnut in West Virginia.

As most of you know, the American chestnut was decimated by a fungal disease known as chestnut blight in the early to mid-1900s. Once growing to be 120 feet tall and up to 13 feet in diameter, according to Gifford Pinchot, finding finding tree over 25 feet now is a rarity,

so you can imagine my excitement upon seeing this 80-ft monster. Luckily, this tree exhibited no signs of blight.

- National Woodland Owners Association (NWOA) January 10th "Woodland Word" shared an NBC News Item that brought attention to a lack of funding focus for addressing Beech Leaf Disease and some new research indicating the beech leaf-eating nematodes cause cellular damage in the trees similar to the effect cancer cells have in mammals. USDA Helps Producers Prepare for and Recover from Severe Winter Weather

As you prepare for the potential impacts of upcoming winter weather, know that USDA offers several programs to help with recovery. Here are 2 programs relating to woodlands:

- The <u>Emergency Forest Restoration Program (EFRP)</u> helps the owners of non-industrial private forests restore forest health damaged by natural disasters.
- Tree Assistance Program (TAP) focuses on nursery/orchard trees.


